VIDA HOME

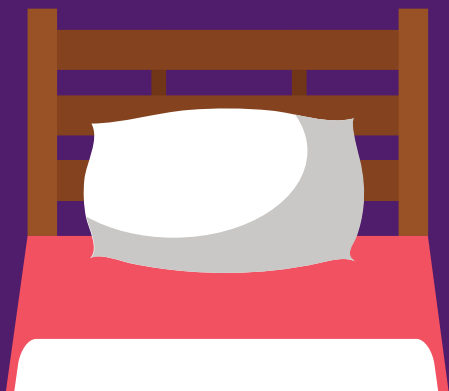


WHAT IS THE VIDA HOME?

The Vida Home is a 6 bed home in a confidential location in Washington, DC. Individuals are able to stay at the Vida Home for up to 90 days while they work with a case manager to accomplish goals for their next step.

The home is open from 6pm-9am on the weekdays and all day on the weekends. Survivor Residents of the Vida Home agree to a 10pm curfew on the weekdays and 11pm curfew on the weekends.

In order to maintain safety, Survivor Residents agree to keep the address of the Vida Home confidential and allow staff to check belongings when entering the home. The Vida Home is a drug, alcohol and weapons free residence.



WHO CAN COME?

WHAT YOU GET

SUPPORT

Trained staff are able to provide emotional support to Survivor Residents at the Vida Home. Survivor Residents have access to case management at the drop-in center and in the community.

GROUPS

Our Direct Services Manager holds a weekly support group to discuss topics including: healthy relationships, boundaries and internet safety. Our Housing Manager holds weekly meetings to discuss the needs of the home.

OUTINGS AND ACTIVITIES

On the weekends, staff and volunteers participate in outings and activities with Survivor Residents such as: movies, museums, painting, and crafts.

BASIC NEEDS

Survivor Residents are provided with shared groceries and access to a kitchen. Survivor Residents also receive weekly metro fare and access to clothing and hygiene products.
